The addition of three more matinees was well received by our audiences and we will continue this format for next year. The offer of seat cushions has also helped with their comfort during the shows.

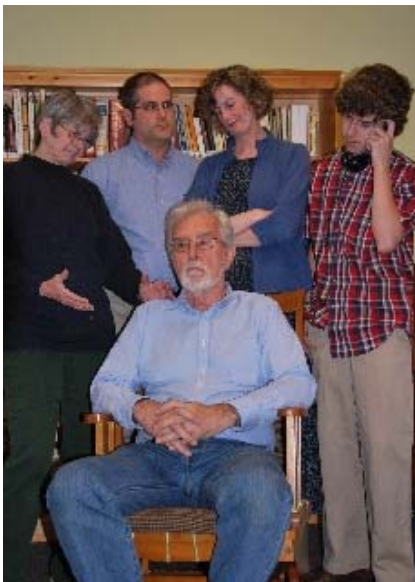
