SYNOPSIS

Mingling suspense and humour, this ingeniously plotted thriller follows unexpected twists and turns resulting in a mild-mannered professor of philosophy driven to apparent murder to protect his reputation and career. Thereafter, as the professor and his wife plot a foolproof way to dispose of the body, complications arise in the form of a rather sinister young student who happened to witness the professor's disposal of the body. Add in a suspicious police lieutenant and you have all the ingredients for a series of suspenseful, unexpected and frequently funny developments leading to a denouement which will catch everyone by surprise.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Professor Henry Lowenthal and his wife, Polly, are looking forward to Henry assuming the exalted Voorhees Chair after many years of teaching and leading the philosophy department at Copeland University. Henry is a life-long student of Socrates and has always believed in doing the right thing, both ethically and morally. So it is a profound shock when he finds himself compromised on this position, arguing with Edith Wilshire, a much younger woman who has taken over the department and is changing its focus completely. Edith tells Henry he is not going to get the Voorhees Chair, and Henry loses his whole life's philosophy with one blow.

What follows is a slightly farcical plot, involving a seen-it-all policeman, Lt. Dave DeVito, and a rich self-involved slightly manic university student, Melvin McMullen. The older characters are committed to ethical behavior and the greater good while the younger ones seek opportunism and self-gratification.

Which side wins and how it is played out tests the character of both Henry and Polly and a surprising denouement brings a real twist to the climax of this questioning and entertaining play.




in Halifax. Penelope is the recipient of the William Wylie Arts Award from the Stratford Festival. Many thanks to a great cast and a superlative crew.




experiences have been wild. This should keep him out of trouble (maybe) during the next part of his life.
