

#### Synopsis:

An announcement in the local paper states the time and place of a murder, in Little Paddocks, Miss Blacklock's house. The victim is not one of the several occupants but an unexpected and unknown visitor. A second death occurs before a determined Inspector can unravel the mixed motives and concealed identities. Meddling Miss Jane Marple is on hand to provide the final solution — at some danger to herself — in a dramatic confrontation scene just before the final curtain.

The action takes place in the two drawing rooms, which have been made into one room, in an early Victorian house in Chipping Cleghorn in the 1950's.


#### Murray Shaw (Rudi Scherz)


