

Nick (Act I scene 3) lives with Sandy (Act II scene 2); Sandy also has a sister Yolanda (Act II scene 3); Bob & Yolanda Wheeler live next door to Betsy and Lou.

Tommy is a shock rocker on tour; Charlie is a friend of Yolanda, and Steve has had a bad experience with Yolanda; Davey is married to Linda and knows Little Jim who works with Eddie! Confused yet? Throw in a live radio show and the fun begins. Enjoy!
