

Paul Slade Smith is a writer and actor based in Brooklyn, New York. His play *Unnecessary Farce*, winner of nine regional theatre awards, has had over 250 productions throughout the United States and in Canada, Great Britain, Australia, Switzerland, Iceland, and Singapore. As an actor, Paul has appeared in the original Broadway casts of *Finding Neverland, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* and the Lincoln Center revival of *My Fair Lady*. He has also been seen in the national tours of *Wicked* and *The Phantom of the Opera*,

and at regional theatres including The Goodman, Steppenwolf, American Repertory Theatre and Chicago Shakespeare Theatre.

THE DIRECTOR'S NOTES



Political Satire has been with us since Aristotle justified the mockery of politicians who misbehaved. He exposed them to ridicule to "laugh folly out of existence." The contemporary style of satirical venting about our elected officials comes from comedic artists such as Jon Stewart and the Daily Show, the Colbert Report, Jimmy Kimmel, John Oliver, SNL and CBC's Because News. Today's satire is becoming vicious and partisan. But not so *The Outsider* by Paul Slade Smith. He has created a more palatable lampoonery and

makes fun of the whole process of politics and the absurdity of the political arena. The playwright creates a non-partisan approach with hilarious pivotal moments that pay tribute to the honest and capable politicians out there with a genuine desire to serve the people and win the public's support. Who knew that could work?
